



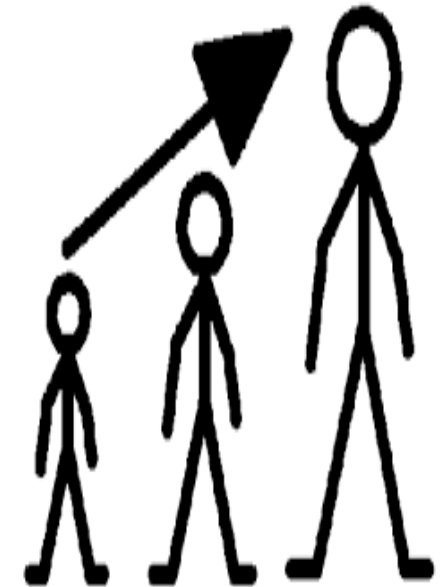
Things to think about as you move Towards Adulthood

- Make sure you have an annual health check with your GP. (This is normally free)
- Make sure you/guardian or carer are in receipt of the correct benefits.
- Make sure that you have all the correct information in a file about who services any equipment you may have.
- Will you need any adaptations in your home in the future? If so contact your Child Lead professional.

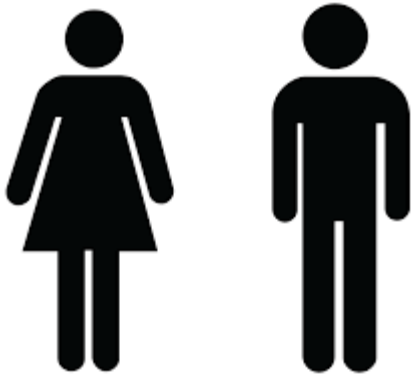

Additional actions at Year 11 review

Your transition plan needs to include:

- Issues around transport changes post-16 . Check transport policy with school / college.
- Moving from school to college. You may be asked to share information with an education provider and/or course tutors.
- Ensure you have access to careers and learning advisor support.
- Ensure Funding applications are requested if required and longer term plans made.
- Ensure that Health services, including your GP, are made aware of your needs.
- Ensure there is an agreement on who co-ordinates the next review.

School

Your transition plan should be updated with key action points to be carried out by the named worker(s).

A professional will help with supporting you to visit different places and activities that you may like to go to once you are 18.

As necessary, the adult transition coordinator will also link in with your lead professional to arrange meetings to make sure any support services that have been identified are considered for future planning.



What next?

The adult transition coordinator will meet with everyone to make sure all the information that has been shared is still up-to-date and that you are still working towards achieving your goals

The transition coordinator or allocated lead professional will also start to complete their assessment using information which has already been recorded on your Child/school plans.

Depending on any additional needs you may have, other referrals may be made at this time to ensure other health professionals in adult services know about you and your needs.
