Travel

Although Guernsey is a small Island it has good and frequent transport links with many places. Whichever form of transport you are using, please contact the carrier prior to travelling, to enquire about any additional assistance that you might require.

Please be aware that the National Health Service does not operate in Guernsey and there is a charge for doctors and dentists, as well as the ambulance service. Guernsey Airport

The [airport terminal](#) covers two floors, with the main departures and arrivals areas situated on the ground floor. There is a lift to the upper floor. There are accessible toilets on both floors.

Guernsey harbour

The [passenger terminal building](#) at St Peter Port harbour is level throughout and wheelchair access ramp at the side entrance. Accessible toilet facilities are available inside the terminal.

A daily boat service is available. They require prior notice of any special assistance you might require. Due to the height of the tide, sometimes it is difficult to embark/ disembark.

There are no cars on Sark but a tractor-bus is available to take visitors up to the top of Harbour Hill. Horses & carriages and bicycles are the only other means of transport. It would be advisable to inform the horse & carriage company about any special assistance you may require, at the time of booking. There is an accessible toilet at the harbour and alternative spacious toilets at the Bel Air (at the top of Harbour Hill), and at the Island Hall (near the Avenue). The toilets are normally open during the day so no keys are necessary.

[Herm](#) is the smallest of the Channel Islands normally visited by day-trippers. An accessible toilet is available within the white house hotel. The public toilets are currently being revamped and will include an accessible toilet for 2022 season.

Disembarkation is at [Herm Harbour](#) or Rosaire Steps depending on the height of the tide. Access at Rosaire can be difficult due to a number of steps and a rough sloping path for about ¼ mile to the harbour.

It is best to inform the boat company about any special assistance you may require before travelling so that advice can be given regarding which sailings would give best access.

Alderney lies some twenty miles to the north east of Guernsey and is an integral part of the Island group, which constitutes the Bailiwick of Guernsey. There are daily scheduled flights from Guernsey which take about 15 minutes.

Accessibility within the island can be a little restrictive to those who are wheelchair users. Alderney Airport has steps and a ramp at the entry/exit gate so that it can be accessed by wheelchairs. The town of St Anne's is quite hilly and some of the main streets are cobbled.

Getting around Guernsey

Buses



Guernsey has [accessible buses](#) with 'low floor' buses, with kneeling suspension, to allow easier access. They have a wheelchair ramp and a dedicated wheelchair space.

Parking



The Driver and Vehicle Licensing department operate a blue badge parking scheme.

The badge permits a vehicle driven by or carrying a blue badge holder to park for up to two hours in both half-hour and one-hour disc parking spaces and to use accessible parking spaces. Visitors may use their own blue parking card if they bring it to the Island.

Badge holders must obey all other parking regulations and may not park on yellow lines.

Shopping

St Peter Port

Guernsey's capital, St Peter Port is a town that has grown uphill with many of its attractive narrow streets meandering upwards. This characteristic is considered by most people to be one of the charms of the Island and it certainly provides a very attractive setting when viewed from the harbour and the sea. It does, however, make access more difficult for those who have a physical disability.

[High Street](#) is cobbled and on a gradient. There is also a kerb on each side of the street. Access to most department stores such as Boots, Creasey's and Marks and Spencer's

(easily accessible and also good lighting inside) is good and on a level with the pavement. Marks & Spencers, Creasey's and Boots have a lift to all floors.

Commercial Arcade is closed to traffic and has a flagstone surface.

Le Pollet is mainly pedestrianised cobbled street on a slight gradient. Many shops have easy access with no steps or pavements to negotiate. Once inside however, generally shops are small and not easily accessible for wheelchair users.

Lower Pollet is a tarmac road, open to traffic but on the flat, with some on-the-street parking. Pavements are not very wide but there is level access to most establishments in this street.

Smith Street is mainly pedestrianised tarmac road on a steep hill, with most shops having a step at the entrance. The main Post Office is in Smith Street and has dedicated accessible door.

Market Square is a cobbled, level area. Access to Market Square is via an access ramp from the Commercial Arcade. There is access to the **Guille Alles** Library.

Bordage and Fountain Street are both open to traffic and are reached via steps/ ramp from the Arcade or via the the pedestrian crossing by the Town Church.

South Esplanade is where the Bus Terminus is located. It is relatively flat between the Terminus and the start of town. There is a wide flagstone pavement on the level with parking.

Mill Street has brick and granite cobbles and is on a steep gradient. Vehicular access is by permit only.

Mansell Street has restricted vehicular access and is laid in cobbles.

The Quay is flat with a wide flagstone pavement. Parking is available on either the Crown or Albert Piers. Access is available to the lower floors of department stores otherwise accessible from the High Street. Most shops, cafes and restaurants have level access with the pavement or are one step up.

North Plantation has traffic restrictions placed upon it. The Information Centre is situated here.

North Esplanade is a flat, major vehicular route. There are dropped kerbs and tactile paving placed at the pedestrian controlled crossing, which links the main 'North Beach' car parking area to the north side of town.

Seating around St Peter Port

Although there are few seats in the main streets, you will find seating around St Peter Port at Church Square, Market Square, Trinity Square, North Plantation, Albert Pier and Crown Pier.

St Sampson's

St Sampson's is the second largest shopping area in the north of the island. The entire area is flat and there is parking very near to the shops. There are 2 clearing banks a post office, chemist and other shops.

South Side

There is a wide flagstone pavement along South Side.

The Bridge

The Bridge has a very wide pavement. A lot of shops on the Bridge do not have steps.

North Side

North Side has a standard width pavement. There is a Unisex radar toilet.

Seating around St Sampson's

There is seating provided around St Sampson's Harbour.

St Martins

The village has limited parking facilities adjacent to the shops along, La Grande Rue, with a large tarmac public car park situated near in the middle of the area.

There are is one clearing banks situated in St Martin's and three large food stores. A Unisex radar toilet can be found at Rue Maze opposite the community centre.

Cobo

On the West coast is another small, but convenient shopping centre. The area is served by its own tarmac-covered car park that is adjacent to a supermarket and Post Office, chip shop and Cobo store and a pharmacy.

L'islet

Another small shopping centre is formed around a busy crossroads, where there is a carpark, supermarket and other shops.

St Pierre du Bois

The small shopping area of St Peter's has a supermarket, clearing bank, shops and a Post Office. There is car parking in front of the Post Office and in front of the supermarket.

Accessible parking is available in the Town Church Square. The route is sound to the entrance where there is one step. Not all public sections are accessible, however private interviews can be held in an accessible office. Cash dispensers are internal and the screen is visible from a wheelchair. Assistance dogs are permitted.

Parking is available. There is a sound route to a level entrance. All public sections are accessible. A cash dispenser is available. Assistance dogs are permitted.

There is an accessible parking space and a sound route to a level entrance. All public sections are accessible, there are no cash dispensers. Assistance dogs are permitted.

There is an accessible parking space in the Town Church Square. The route is sound and there is one step at the entrance. All public sections are accessible and private interviews can be held in an accessible office. Cash dispensers are internal and external and the screen is visible from a wheel chair. Assistance dogs are permitted.

There is an accessible parking space at the top of Smith Street which is however, a steep hill. The route is sound and there is a level entrance at the side of the building and a lift to all floors. All sections are accessible. There are four cash dispensers in the lobby one of which custom built for wheelchair users. There is an accessible toilet and assistance dogs are permitted.

There is an accessible parking space, with a sound route to a ramped main entrance.. All public sections are accessible. There is level access to cash dispensers, which are external and screens are visible from wheelchairs. Assistance dogs are permitted.

There is nearby parking with a sound route to a ramped main entrance. All sections are accessible. There is level access to the internal and external cash dispensers, the external dispenser having a screen, which is visible from a wheelchair. Assistance dogs are permitted.

Difficult access for wheelchair users. The site has a moderate slope and step to access and there are steps within the venue.

Designed with the needs of wheelchair users in mind, this Nature Trail follows the perimeter of a football ground and includes a pond and small area of marshland, making it an important habitat for plant, pond and other wildlife.

There are multiple steps or a steep slope to access and the venue is split into 3 levels internally with steps.

Main entrance steep slope and multiple steps, alternative entrance, steep slope. Pathways inside the venue are uneven.

Easy slope to access. There is level access around the venue.

Bays and Beaches

L'Ancrese / Pembroke, Vale

Large sandy beach with adjoining car parks and slipways at either end of the beach, providing access for wheelchair users and those with a physical disability. Accessible toilets and a kiosk are situated at the Beach House cafe on the western side of the beach. A beach wheelchair can be loaned at this location. Please contact info@gsybeachwheelchairs.com.

Chouet, Vale

Large car park, with slipway leading to hard sand on the beach. An accessible toilet, kiosk and tearoom are all nearby.

Ladies Bay, Vale

Large sandy bay, accessed by slipway from the adjoining car park. Toilets are situated nearby.

Port Soif, Vale

A small sandy bay, with toilets and a kiosk. Access to the beach is however difficult.

Grandes Rocques (Saline Bay), Castel

Large sandy beach, accessed by soft sand covered path with steps next to the beach kiosk, or via a steep access ramp from Saline Car Park. Toilets are situated near to the kiosk.

Cobo, Castel

A large sandy bay, with a car park situated near to a kiosk, toilets and slipway at the northern and southern end of the beach.

Vazon Bay, Castel

Large beach, with adjoining car park, beach kiosk, accessible toilet and slipway. The slipway is long and shallow leading to firm sand, making it ideal for wheelchair users.

L'Eree, St Peter's

Large sandy bay with a slipway at the northern end. There are two large car parks, a kiosk, a café and toilets nearby

Rocquaine Bay, St Peter's

Large sandy bay with slipway access at either end of the beach. Parking is available between the two slipways and a kiosk and toilet facilities are situated at the southern end of the beach.

Portelet Bay, Torteval

Small sandy beach with parking 100 metres from steep cobbled slipway, providing access to the beach. A kiosk and toilets(including an accessible toilet) are situated nearby.

Petit Bot, Forest

Sandy cove at the bottom of a long, steep hill. Car parking is available on the valley road, and access to the beach is limited due to the cobbled slipway leading to pebbles. A tearoom and toilet facilities are situated at the top of the slipway.

Saints Bay, St Martin's

Steep hill down to rocky cove with kiosk and toilets. Although there is a slipway, the cove is not very accessible.

Moulin Huet, St Martin's

A sandy cove with a car park 800 metres away. The access lane is steep, with approx. 20 steps at the end to the beach therefore difficult for wheelchair users and those with a physical disability. Kiosk and toilets 180 metres from the top of the steps.

Petit Port, St Martin's

Large sandy cove reached by 306 steps. Not accessible to wheelchair users and those with a physical disability.

Fermain Bay, St Martin's

A pebble beach reached by a steep valley road, Vehicular access is strictly by permit only. Blue badgeholders are able to obtain permits from the Traffic Services Section of the Environment Department (tel. +44 (0) 1481 243400) to be able to be dropped off/collected at the bay. There are toilets and a café at the top of the slipway.

Havelet Bay, St Peter Port

Sandy beach in St Peter Port, South of the harbour and accessible by a slipway.

Accessible toilets

The following toilets are in public places and fitted with radar national key scheme locks. Visitors to Guernsey are recommended to consider bringing their own RADAR keys with them. Keys are available from the Guernsey Information Centre, Batif International, Guernsey Airport Information Centre and Health Connections (at Beau Sejour) for a £3 deposit.

Guernsey presently does **not** have a changing places toilet facility.

St Peter Port

South Esplanade, Bus Terminus

Health and Treatment

Guernsey's Health Service is not part of the UK National Health Service. There is no reciprocal health agreement between Guernsey and the British Government. This means that UK residents travelling to the islands will also be charged for medical treatment within the hospital. There are a limited number of exceptions for certain contagious diseases and compulsory psychiatric treatment. For information on charges: www.gov.gg/ED

Primary care doctors, dentists and other health professionals, in private practice and all patients are required to pay for treatment. This can be at a surgery, at your temporary residence or at the Princess Elizabeth Hospital including the Emergency department. There are also charges for the ambulance service and repatriation, to where you are ordinarily resident, if required.

Medical insurance is strongly recommended. Policies should be checked to ensure that cover is provided for travel to the Channel Islands and includes cover for the type of accommodation you have chosen, including staying with friends and family.

The Emergency department at the Princess Elizabeth Hospital is manned 24 hours a day by doctors in private practice.
